Option 1 - Scales & Arpeggios from memory

For the examination the Candidate should be asked to perform all of the following scales and arpeggios from memory. Play each scale and arpeggio tongued or slurred (as requested by the teacher/examiner)

#### Scales

Majors: A, E & B (extended from the lowest key note up to top B and back down to down to low C sharp and back up to starting note.)

Minors: C# & F# harmonic, B & G# melodic (all two octaves)

#### **Arpeggios**

Majors: A & B (two octaves)
Minors: B, C# & G# (two octaves)

#### Chromatic scale

Starting on B (two octave)

#### Dominant 7th

In the key of E (two octaves)

#### **Diminished 7ths**

Starting on B (two octaves)

#### Whole tone scale

Starting on B (two octaves)

#### Option 2 - Alternative to scales from memory

Instead of learning the scales and arpeggios from memory candidates may prepare all the scales and arpeggios listed in option 1 **with the music**, using the appropriate articulations and rhythms for this level which can be downloaded from the website – see <u>MTB Option 2 – Alternative to Scales and arpeggios from memory</u> sheet.
